





#### **Bowel Cancer Screening Pre and Post Procedure Diabetic Instruction**

## **Colonoscopy Patients**

This information is in addition to the instructions you have already received for bowel preparation. Please follow the instructions for bowel preparation carefully.

As a diabetic you are at an increased risk of having a 'hypo' (low blood sugarsymptoms include sweating, shakiness, blurred vision, lightheadedness) when not eating for any length of time.

### **DAY BEFORE COLONOSCOPY**:

Follow the bowel preparation instruction provided and aim to replace your usual carbohydrate intake by drinking 100mls of any clear fluid that contains glucose every two hours throughout the afternoon and evening (e.g. apple juice, lemonade).

# If your blood glucose level is less than five (<5) then you should have additional glucose drinks.

- In the event of hypoglycaemia (Blood glucose less than 4.0 mmols/l)
  - Drink 200ml of a sugary drink i.e. (small carton) of smooth orange juice, 5 glucotabs, 6 dextrose tablets or 5 jelly babies.
  - Recheck glucose level in 10-15 minutes if you do not feel better or blood glucose is still less than 4.0 mmols/l repeat one of the treatments mentioned above up to three times.
  - When you feel better with blood glucose above 4mmols/L, have two (2) plain biscuits (ie. Rich tea or malted biscuits)
  - ➤ Continue with your bowel preparation as per instruction provided. If you suffer a hypo again (less than 4mmols/l) stop the bowel preparation, start eating and call the screening centre on **0208 869 3362**.
  - ➤ If not improving or become unconscious, you will need immediate emergency treatment. Someone should dial 999 for an ambulance.
